


My story at the chair of land management begins in the year 2010, when I decided to switch my minor in Geography to Land Management at TUM.



One of my first lectures at TUM was "Fundamentals in spatial planning" that was lectured by Prof. Magel and had multiple interesting guest lecturers. 5




